Summer Internship 2015 | Call for Applications

The Regional Resource Centre for Elementary Education (RRCEE) is offering two internship positions during the summer of 2015. The internships will provide an opportunity for college students to engage with issues in elementary education.

The interns will engage in the activities of the Centre, pursue research, attend lectures and seminars, and to interact with academicians and teachers. In 2015, RRCEE will have two distinct internship positions: a) Media Intern and b) Research Intern. The Media Intern will be working closely on RRCEE's website and podcast series on education. The Research Intern will be involved in supporting the activities of the Centre and pursuing research in a specific area concerning elementary education.

Who is Eligible?

Applications are open to students (both graduate and post graduate) and recent graduates. Applicants with courses in Education or other social science disciplines will be preferred. Proficiency in English and working knowledge of word processing software(s) and computers is expected.

Duration

The duration for the summer internship is typically a month or two. This is usually discussed with the Interns depending on their college leave and other aspects. However, the minimum duration is one month, starting May 2015.

Stipend

The Centre does not provide a stipend for interns. Also, interns are expected to make their own arrangements for travel & accommodation in Delhi.
